

From the Romans, to the twentieth century, this book can be read to the class, or incorporated into lesson planning to give well rounded, historical teachings.

This activity asks the learner to reflect on their own beliefs and cultural practices, and consider how they fit into different contexts, such as country or demographic. This is a good activity/discussion point to highlight how the surrounding society can have an effect on your own beliefs and practices, and how it may feel if the two do not necessarily align.

Through Devon Development Education, Cultural Champions are available to discuss various cultures and beliefs throughout the year. This could take place as a visit to the school or as an organised Zoom call. For example, you could arrange to hear the story of Diwali from a local Hindu Cultural Champion and experience different celebration foods.
