



The New Build, Uganda, July/August 2005. Project Report



During July 2005 a group of 14 young adults travelled to Gulu District in Northern Uganda. Their purpose was to assist with the building of a new vocational training centre attached to Keyo primary school. Prior to travelling to Uganda each member of the team had raised money for the building materials that were required. A fantastic total of £15,043.90 was raised in less than 12 months!

All of the team have now returned to the UK and all thoroughly enjoyed the whole experience. The project was supported strongly by the local population. With fourteen skilled tradesmen volunteering to work every day for the duration of the project, eighteen young women and a vast number of children were also helping.
