

Fairtrade Tea Primary Schools Conferences 2025

The following is a general outline of proposed activities for this year's conferences. They can be adapted to individual situations, times etc. The conferences will be led by Alison Derrick and/or Sue Errington.

Aims of the conferences: to provide an opportunity for pupils to:

- Find out the benefits of buying Fairtrade products
- Learn how tea is transformed from a leaf in a field to tea in our cups
- Find out where tea is produced in the world focusing on Kenya, India and Sri Lanka
- Engage in global citizenship by learning about FT producers and how they benefit from The Fairtrade Premium
- Sample 3 different types of tea and experience tea tasting
- Meet pupils from other schools and have an interesting and enjoyable morning.
